Workgroup Purpose

Chapter 74/Senate Bill 66, Section 6.5-104, DHCD is required to:

- "...the Office shall meet quarterly to collaborate with the appropriate units of state government, including the Department of Information Technology, the State Department of Education, the State Department of Transportation, the Maryland State Library, the Department of Commerce, the Department of Agriculture, the Maryland Department of Health, and the Department of Planning, and the appropriate units of local government, including the Maryland Association of Counties and the Maryland Municipal League, to ensure that efforts to expand and enhance broadband internet services are coordinated statewide."
- Workgroup will assist with DHCD's Office of Statewide Broadband's efforts to ensure that broadband efforts are coordinated statewide
 - Meetings with State Agencies will take place separately

Program Expansion: Office of Statewide Broadband

- ► The Office of Statewide Broadband (OSB) was established by SB66, Digital Connectivity Act of 2021 signed into law (CH74) by the Governor in April 2021
 - The Office is housed at DHCD
- ▶ SB66 Responsibilities and Definitions:
 - Construction and Access to Infrastructure
 - Ensure that all households have physical access to broadband infrastructure for service
 - Equity
 - Ensure that everyone has the financial resources, equipment, and digital skills needed to get online
 - Inclusion
 - Ensure that the benefits of the internet and digital technologies are available to everyone








Funding provided to date

Annual Program Funding










Funding by program



OSB: Program Status cont.

- Maryland Emergency Broadband Benefit Program (MEBB)
 - Provides a service subsidy of up to \$15 per month to eligible low and moderate income households, developed for Equity and Inclusion efforts
 - Utilizes the Federal American Connectivity Program (ACP) for eligibility and enrollment. If a household is enrolled in ACP, they automatically are eligible for MEBB
 - Program slated to run through December 2023, extended from August 2022
 - Performance for FY22
 - 121,864 households received subsidy
 - \$4,637,185 expended

Connect MD: Network Infrastructure

- Open for applications
- Internet Service Provider (ISP)
- \$95 million
- \$800,000 to \$4.5MM
- 10%, 20%, 30% of construction cost depending on density of service area
- January 2023
- Competitive Scoring



OSB: New Programs Underdevelopment

Maryland Device Subsidy Program - \$30 Million

- Will provide to jurisdictions for eligible low/moderate income households
- Procurement bids received, contract in process
- Project expected to begin Q4 2022

Broadband for Public Housing - \$45 Million

- Will provide grants to local jurisdictions to retrofit public housing for broadband distribution
- Applications expected to go live Q1 2023

Digital Connectedness - \$23.72 Million

- Will provide grants to local jurisdictions to help offset costs associated with difficult to connect homes
- Rollout expected in 1st quarter 2023







OSB: What Else?

- Preparing for BEAD and DE plan production (as required by BIL)
 - Contracting with the Eastern Shore Regional GIS Cooperative (ESRGC)
 - Production of broadband mapping
 - Production of Broadband Plan (via subconsultant)
 - Production of Digital Equity Plan (via subconsultant)
- ► Awarded \$966,659.11 from NTIA for our Digital Equity Act plan
- ▶ Pending \$5MM for our BEAD plan and implementation of the plan
