DEPARTMENT OVERVIEW

The Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) is the state's housing finance agency, providing resources for affordable rental development and sustainable homeownership and working with local governments, nonprofits, and other partners to achieve responsive and responsible community revitalization. Additionally, DHCD is also currently administering billions in federal and state pandemic relief funds.





The agency's rental housing production has reached unprecedented levels. In Fiscal Year 2022, approximately **\$1.2 billion** has been invested in affordable rental housing development, including **\$504 million** in federal low-income housing tax credits and state funds. In the most recent competitive tax credit award round in 2022, **more than \$32 million** in project awards were made through tax credits and state Rental Housing Funds. These awards will result in the creation or preservation of **1,340 high quality, energy-efficient, affordable rental units** for Maryland's working families, seniors, and persons with disabilities.

MARYLAND MORTGAGE PROGRAM

The Maryland Mortgage Program (MMP) has grown significantly, surpassing **\$1 billion** in mortgage loan reservations annually for the last three years. On average, the MMP program provides mortgages to **more than 4,000 Marylanders** and their families each year. The program offers a nationally recognized array of mortgage and down payment assistance options that are responsive to an ever-changing housing market, including innovative products like Maryland SmartBuy.


NEIGHBORHOOD REVITALIZATION

The department promotes responsible redevelopment and community services for Maryland's unique neighborhoods, towns, and cities. In Fiscal Year 2022, **\$232.8 million** has supported revitalization projects, and services to improve urban, suburban, and rural communities. The Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development has also worked with the City of Baltimore on an innovative and effective urban revitalization strategy that has removed **more than 5,200** blighted properties for public parks and commercial and residential development.

SMALL BUSINESS ASSISTANCE

Neighborhood BusinessWorks provided **\$9.3 million** in capital to **44 new and growing small businesses** last fiscal year. The program also will deploy **\$103 million** received through the federal State Small Business Credit Initiative (SSBCI) to support businesses and entrepreneurs in traditionally underserved communities. DHCD is administering the SSBCI program for the State of Maryland, which is receiving a total of **\$198 million** between three state agencies.

ENERGY EFFICIENCY AND HOME REPAIRS

The department promotes energy efficiency and green building practices to help ensure Maryland's environmental health and housing efficiency. In Fiscal Year 2022, the department invested **\$37.9 million** into the department's energy programs, which include EmPOWER, Weatherization Assistance Program, and BeSMART. An array of weatherization and energy-efficiency programs have improved the quality of life for Maryland homeowners and renters by making their homes modern and comfortable while reducing utility costs.



PANDEMIC RESPONSE RELIEF AND RECOVERY

In addition to operating its fundamental programs, the department served as the lead agency administering **more than \$2 billion** in state and federal resources for COVID-19 response and recovery. In partnership with local jurisdictions, **more than \$758 million** was administered through the Emergency Rental Assistance Program to prevent eviction and provide rent relief to renters and landlords. The Maryland Homeowner Assistance Fund provides **nearly \$250 million** to homeowners struggling with delinquent mortgage payments or other housing costs due to the pandemic.
