How do I find out if my own city is a Main Street Maryland Community?

How much time does it take to become a Main Street Maryland designated community?

The time that it takes to become a designated Main Street Maryland community varies depending on the community's readiness. The application process can take 6 months to a year. Newly designated communities can take anywhere from 2 to 3 years to meet the National Main Street Center's standards for accreditation.

What should I do if my city is interested in becoming a Main Street community?

Who is eligible to apply to become a designated Main Street Maryland community?

An application for Designation may be completed and submitted by a local government (municipality or county) or nonprofit organization that has local government support.

Maryland cities or towns meeting the following criteria are eligible for MSM designation:

- A minimum population of 1,000 based on the most recent U.S. Census survey
- Must be a designated Sustainable Community approved by the State of Maryland
- Must have a defined central business district with a significant number of historic commercial buildings.
- Boundaries of the proposed Main Street area must be within a Priority Funding Area as determined by the Maryland Department of Planning
- Demonstrate a commitment to employ a local Main Street Manager
- Demonstrate a commitment to support a local Main Street program budget
- Demonstrate a commitment to organize and maintain volunteer committees made up of public and private sector individuals

What is the role of historic preservation in Main Street Maryland Communities and nationally?

Historic Preservation and design are essential components of the Main Street Maryland Program. Many older commercial districts throughout Maryland have suffered from a legacy of disinvestment. Maintaining a community's rich historical and cultural character begins with keeping the buildings and structures that line its streets. Quality of place remains a key factor in where people choose to live, and businesses choose to open their doors. Historic Preservation is a platform for positive rehabilitation and adaptive reuse projects.

Does Main Street Maryland offer training?

Yes, Main Street Maryland offers a variety of training opportunities. Training varies from classroom style instruction to virtual meetings and recorded presentations. There are also a variety of topical resource documents/manuals available.

How do I become a volunteer in a Main Street Maryland Community?

We encourage you to contact the local Main Street Program where you live, or the closest one to your home. Our Main Street Maryland Managers typically have different volunteer positions for staffing seasonal events or to support day to day practical office operations.
