Carroll County / Human Services Programs of Carroll County	Provide funding to renovate a building to relocate a family homeless shelter in Westminster. The new location will serve more families in a safer environment.	\$800,000
Cecil County	Provide funding to renovate and expand an existing building used as a child advocacy center in Elkton.	\$672,000
Town of North East (Cecil County) / Enterprise Community Development, Inc.	Provide funding to construct 48 units of affordable housing. CDBG funding is to be used for acquisition and construction fees.	\$784,874
Charles County / Osprey Property	Provide funding to construct 48 units of affordable housing in LaPlata. CDBG funding is to be used for acquisition and construction fees.	\$800,000
City of Cambridge (Dorchester County) / Boys and Girls Club of Metropolitan Baltimore	Provide funding to renovate a former school building for use as a Boys and Girls Club.	\$800,000
Frederick County	Provide funding to improve a 28-unit affordable senior housing development owned by the County in Woodsboro.	\$500,000
Town of Grantsville (Garrett County) / Garrett County Community Action Committee, Inc.	Provide funding to renovate a senior center.	\$100,000
Town of Millington (Kent County) / Home Partnership of Cecil County	Provide funding to construct 52 units of affordable senior housing. CDBG funding is to be used for construction of associated	\$800,000

Talbot County /For All Seasons Inc.	Provide funding to renovate a building in Easton used to provide mental health services to low- and moderate-income persons.	\$750,000
Washington County / San Mar Children's Home	Provide funding to renovate a building into 15 apartments for girls who age out of the foster care system. This is a short-term program to prevent homelessness and to provide a variety of services to ensure they can transition into adulthood.	\$722,402
Town of Pittsville (Wicomico County)	Provide funding to improve the water treatment plant to correct issues with drinking water impacted by high iron levels.	\$800,000
Worcester County	Provide funding for the County's housing rehabilitation program for low- and moderate-income homeowners.	\$50,000
Town of Berlin (Worcester County)	Provide funding to demolish several blighted buildings and prepare preliminary architectural and engineering services for the construction of a building to feature a Head Start Center, afterschool and summer programs, and other community purposes.	\$100,000
